- ☐ Add the Prodeko Calendar to your calendar [here](#)
- ☐ Read this guide, the newsletters and other information material sent by your study coordinator at Aalto University, and follow the instructions for pre-arrival arrangements.
- ☐ Order a physical student card or download the Frank app. Currently, the physical student card is the only option for exchangers.
- ☐ Pay the AYY membership fee and become a member of Prodeko (<https://prodeko.org/en/guild/joining-guild/>) and pay the membership fee (8€), which gives you the right to participate in our events!
- ☐ If you're moving from outside of Finland pack warm! Temperature in Finland can even go below -20 degrees during winter –it's truly chilly here!
- ☐ Get an apartment and make sure you can either pick up your keys for your apartment, or that your ISO will get them for you.
- ☐ **Contact your ISO or the Masters' and International Captain Leo to let them know when you arrive in Finland and whether you can participate to Head Start on Monday evening!**

TEKKARI = A TECH STUDENT

WHAT IS A TEEKKARI

Being a technical student (better known as 'Teekkari') means something more in Finland. On the outside we are known for our 'Teekkarilakki' (a cap with a tussle) and our overalls (for Prodeko they are white with rainbow stripes).

On the other hand, being a Teekkari is a part of our identity which takes its form during the student life. It consists of many things, including knowing the history of technical students and being a part of it. We are also known for inventing all kinds of nice student pranks, called 'Jäynä'. So, beware!

PRODEKO IS A GOOD PLACE

An alma mater trains a civil servant; a community creates a citizen,' said teekkari Nils Wenell at the founding of the Student Union of the Polytechnic Institute in 1872. That statement still holds true today, and there are as many teekkari stories as there are people to tell them. The more you expose your-

self to these stories, the more you'll be amazed by the diversity of teekkari culture. 'Teekkari is what teekkaris do' might be the best way to describe it – but there's no single truth, as each person defines

teekkarihood through their own experiences. Up next are some reflections gathered over the years from Prodeko students, giving you a glimpse into the kind of community that awaits you this coming spring.

OTANIEMI IS, TEEKKARI VILLAGE IS BUILT!

When talking about teekkaris, teamwork and creative madness mustn't be forgotten. In the spirit of the headline's exclamation, there is likely no other campus area in the world, besides the teekkari village, that has been built by students for themselves. And you can be sure that the self-built village isn't the end of our initiatives – it's just the beginning. Even if you don't live in the village, its spaces and the associations operating there will surely become familiar during your time at Aalto. Still, it's good not to cling too tightly to Otaniemi alone – actively explore what the other campuses of Aalto University and the vibrant student life of the Helsinki metropolitan area have to offer you.

NEVER LEAVE A FRIEND BEHIND

"One of the great qualities of the Otaniemi community – especially in this self-centered era of the 2000s – is that I've experienced it as a diverse community that looks after its own and warmly welcomes freshmen. No one is forced to join anything against their will, but I encourage you to explore with an open mind what the Aalto community has to offer as a counterbalance to studying. The range is vast – from the diving club to Spanish language learners, and from choirs to the aviation club..

A TEEKKARI IS KNOWN FOR THEIR MANNERS

Good manners are a hallmark of both a teekkari and a Prodekoian. This doesn't mean that a teekkari doesn't know

how to have fun — quite the opposite: good manners make a teekkari a respected and jolly companion, no matter the time or place. Etiquette can be trained, for example, at sitsit and annual balls, which are academic dinner parties where people dress neatly, eat, and sing. The dress codes range anywhere from overalls and party hats to cocktail, or even white tie for Annual Balls, so pack your evening gowns and suits with you! Sitsit are one of the most unique Finnish student experiences, so don't miss them!

Over the past 150 years, teekkaris have developed a strong singing culture that includes both songs widely known among students and traditional teekkari songs. "A technical student sings rather than well" is a common saying and it sums up our attitude toward singing quite perfectly.

TEKKARI SYMBOLS

— CAP AND OVERALLS

In Finnish academic communities, it has traditionally been important to stand out by using distinctive symbols — and teekkaris are no exception. The most significant symbol of a teekkari is, of course, the white teekkari cap, which has been worn in its current form since the late 19th century. According to tradition, the tassel was added to the cap because, in the male-dominated community, it was observed that the tassel was quite pleasing to the fairer sex...

A significant part of the cap's long history is the fact that the right to wear it must be earned. At Wappu, those freshmen who have demonstrated strong teekkari spirit throughout the year get to don the teekkari cap and use the honorary



title of teekkari.

Alongside the cap, another prominent symbol are the student overalls. At Prodeko, it's a tradition that each new freshman class gets their own overalls, which means that every year group's design is slightly different. The current color scheme of Prodeko's overalls — white with rainbow stripes — originates from the early practice of each class choosing the color of their stripes. However, this was eventually seen as impractical for recognizing friends, so a standardized rainbow-on-white design was adopted. You will have the chance to get the 2026 overalls during orientation week!

PRODEKO'S FACILITIES



THE GUILDROOM

Prodeko's guild room is located in the Maarintie 8 building, more commonly known as 'TUAS', in Otanietti and is open 24/7 for all guild members. The guild room has a pool table, free coffee, videogames, chess, and most importantly, other Prodekoians. The guild room acts as the living room of the whole guild, and thus it's a great place for hanging out, meeting new Prodekoians, studying or doing your course work, and of course taking a break in between!

In addition to the "living room" space, the guild room has Prodeko's gym and a quiet working space next to it. Like the guild room, the gym is also accessible 24/7 for Prodeko members, and there you can find great facilities to work out. No need to pay for a gym membership! The working space, called 'Tuta-klubi' or 'Tuta Club' in English, has desks and monitors for doing your assignments. It's also a great place to find help and peer support if you're struggling with your classes.

Finally, Prodeko has its own terrace right outside of the guild room, next to the TUAS-building parking lot. It's equipped with a grill, as well as a screen and a projector. If the weather's good, it's perfect for a barbeque or movie night!

Outside of Otaniemi, Teekkaris are known, among other things for their pranks (jäynä), tempaus, and singing culture. The Teekkari culture promotes a sense of community and tolerance - Teekkaris accept everyone exactly as they are.



For what matters to you is the long-standing tradition of fuksi education and upbringing. My, and your International Captains' task, is to welcome you to the Aalto community and guide you through your first year or semester in Aalto.

As a fuksi, you will be able to collect fuksi points from various events and activities. These points will introduce you to the Teekkari culture, the Aalto community, Finland, other students of Aalto, as well as to all the fun memories! Collecting enough of these points may grant you the possibility to earn you your very own Teekkari cap.


The International Committee

The International Committee or KvTMK (comes from the Finnish word Kansainvälisyystoimikunta) consists of the people in charge of international students and matters in different guilds and associations and is led by the International Director. prices.




THE GUILDS OF OTANIEMI



Teknologföreningen, TF, is the Swedish-speaking and the only student nation at Aalto. Everyone is welcome to TF regardless of study programme or language. The only requirement is to be interested in learning or speaking Swedish. Teknologföreningen owns Urdsg-jallar, the big concrete building next to Dipoli, and runs their own student restaurant there. TF-members are recognized from their technology red overalls that are usually combined with parts of the guild or university association overalls.



The Guild of Surveying Engineers (Maanmittarikilta) is the association for students in the degree program of Real Estate Economics and Geoinformatics, Sustainable Communities and Built Environment. MK, established in 1901, is the oldest guild that still receives new undergraduate students every year. You can spot the members of the guild by their matte black overalls with a fuchsia colored sleeve. The MK guildroom, Monttu (it means a gob or a pit), is located at the K1 building.



The Guild of Architecture was founded in 1908 and is Otaniemi's second oldest guild still receiving fuksis. It is home to students of Architecture, Landscape Architecture and Interior Architecture, so the members are a mix of students with technical and artistic backgrounds. The Guild of Architecture's overalls are off-white ("painter white") and made of very easily soiled cotton. The Landscape Architects can be identified by the tree on the back of the left leg. Interior Architects design their own fabric to decorate their overalls with. The logo on the back of the overalls is different each year, as it is designed by the fuksis themselves.



The Guild of Civil Engineers, more commonly known as "Raksa", is a subject association that was founded in 1913 and accepts undergraduates studying civil engineering and computational engineering. The association, which was originally named "Engineers' Club" aka IK, is Otaniemi's third oldest guild that still accepts fuksis. During the years 2013-2021, the guild members majored in Energy and Environmental engineering. Raksa members are easily identified by their builders blue overalls with a green sleeve and pocket and their legendary chant of "RAKSA JAKSAA" ("Raksa perseveres!")



The Guild of Mechanical Engineers was founded in 1915, and even with 108 years of history, it is the youngest guild in the School of Engineering. However, it is one of the biggest guild's with over thousand members. Members of KIK can be recognized by their cheerful pink overalls, their pink caterpillar tractor mascot and their jubilant chants of "YY, KAA, KONE!" ("ONE, TWO, MACHINE").



The Guild of Electrical Engineers (also known as SIK) was founded in 1921. The energetic electrical engineers can be identified by their pure white overalls with the new cog logo on the back of the overalls. You can also spot the old lightbulb logo from older students' overalls. SIK's overalls are also decorated by a depiction of a telegram on their right thigh pockets. These overalls can be seen on SIK fuksis from day one, as they are the first guild to receive their overalls in Otaniemi. SIK's chant is "Jappadaida, jappadaida, hei, hyvä SIK!"



The Guild of Physics (aka Fysikkokilta, FK) is a guild founded in 1947. It gathers all Engineering Physics and Mathematics students as well as Quantum Technology students in Aalto under the same roof. Each Engineering Physics and Mathematics student specializes in either physics, or mathematics and systems sciences. The guild's overalls are natural white and in order to get the right shade, fuksis dye their overalls with tea. For Quantum Technology students, the left sleeve is beige.



The Guild of Industrial Engineers (Prodeko) was founded in 1966, although it says 1866 in their overalls due to a legendary mistake. Although the guild only has a small intake, their members are all the more active! Industrial Engineers can be recognised by their white overalls, which are decorated with rainbows. New fuksis design the overalls from the ground up and put them on for the first time in November at the Sikajuhlat, to which you are also warmly welcome!




Tietokilta, or Computer Science Guild, is a student guild founded in 1986. Tietokilta is one of the largest in Otaniemi. Many of the younger guilds in Otaniemi have started as a part of this guild, namely AS, Athene and Data Guild. Members of the guild are recognized by their shiny black overalls with the guild's unofficial @-logo in the back. The chant of the guild can be heard from far away as a two-part call-and-response: "tieto-KILTA!"




The Guild of Automation and Systems Technology AS was founded in 1998. It brings together students majoring in Automation and Robotics, Information Technology as well as Digital Systems and Design. The industrious members can be recognised by violet overalls. The left sleeve is black with a white pocket that reminds of shared history with TiK and SiK and the arduino-blue pocket on the right leg represents Digital Systems and Design students.



Athene, the Guild of Information Networks, was founded by Information Networks students in 1999, and from the year 2022 also includes students of Engineering Psychology. Athene's overalls are forest green or "Athene green"; the left sleeve, collars, and back pockets are black as a tribute to the Computer Science Guild, which Athene separated from in 2003. The guild's official logo, the "eye of Athene," is featured on the back of the overalls.



The Guild of Bioinformation Technology (Inkubio) was founded in 2007. Inkubio is youthful, dynamic and it is the best guild in Otaniemi. As the result of a historic spelling mistake, Inkubio's overalls are a reddish brown, and they are decorated with white "cow" patches, which guild members sew on themselves, to commemorate the time when they were part of the Guild of Electrical Engineers. On their backs, they proudly carry their logo, Maikki, a circuit board in the shape of a cow.



The Association of Process Engineering Students welcomes Chemical Engineering students in both the Finnish and English bachelor programme. Founded in 2012, PT is one of the youngest student associations in Otaniemi. PT's overalls are a blue and have three stripes, yellow, blue, and red, on each limb representing the three CHEM guilds that PT descends from. The association's logo can be found on the back: it depicts a Bourdon tube pressure gauge measuring pressure, one of the most important variables in any process.



Data Guild is the guild for students of the degree programme in Data Science. Founded in 2019, it is the youngest guild in Otaniemi. The members of Data Guild have two different overalls. The older ones are shiny black with a silver sleeve and the current ones are shiny silver with a black sleeve to commemorate the time of Data Science students as part of the Computer Science Guild.




In addition to PT, there are three CHEM guilds influencing in the School of Chemical Engineering; Chemistry Guild, Forest Products Guild and The Guild of Materials and Metallurgy Students. The guilds are active in their own domains; not organizing bachelor fuksi upbringing as this is managed by PT in a collective fashion. The CHEM guild's overalls (red, yellow and blue) have become a rare sight in Otaniemi, but these colors can be seen sewn on to overalls, for example as a sleeve.



There are many more people in Otaniemi than just Prodeko!

There are a total of 14 guilds, university associations and departments that host Fuksis. In addition to the teekkaris, the Otaniemi campus is also home to the business students in their dollar-green overalls and the ARTS members in their Wappu coats. So it's worthwhile to get to know the members of other guilds with an open mind. Otaniemi is full of great people, and you might find fun around the corner with a complete stranger.

Services

Student housing

AYY owns 2700 student apartments and offers home for over 3400 residents. Apartments are located in Otaniemi and Leppävaara in Espoo and in various parts of Helsinki.

Living in AYY's apartments requires AYY membership and a valid right of residence to AYY apartments.

AYY has single room apartments, studios, two room apartments and bigger apartments. Single room apartments are offered primarily to new students and exchange students. All the apartments are unfurnished, and rent includes internet and water. Laundry room and sauna slots are extra service for free.

You can browse and search for AYY's housing through the Domo system: domo.ayy.fi. You can read more detailed application instructions on AYY's Housing website. As a student, you can also apply housing from the Foundation for Student Housing in the Helsinki Region (HOAS).

Advocacy and interest representation

AYY represents students' interests and rights on university level and national level, making sure students are being heard in the society! You can take advantage of AYY's advocacy services, for example, if your exam results are late or you may get in touch with an

equity officer if you encounter any type of harassment. As a member of AYY, you can apply for administration as a student representative and influence the decisions made at the university.

AYY's highest decision-making body is the Representative Council (RepCo), which is elected by vote. In the elections, all AYY members can vote and run as candidates. The next Representative Council elections will be held this fall. Members of the Representative Council decide on the goals and policies of the Student Union.

Student culture

Volunteering, association activities and diverse events are an essential part of Aalto student culture and the Aalto community. The highlights of the year include Wappu and Orientation week events, annual ball, Shrovetide celebrations and many other events.

In addition to the Student Union, events are organised by volunteers who work in sections and committees. AYY has five sections: Community Section Aava, Campus Section, Teekkari (Technical Student) Section, Museum Section, and Advocacy Management Group (more commonly known as EduJory). The call for volunteers will open in late autumn. Information on the call will be published in AYY's communication channels.

In addition, AYY has more than 200 associations that organise activities in the fields of sports, music, games, and other hobbies. New students are always welcome to join association activities, and

the establishment of associations for their activities. Keep an open mind for different opportunities and get to know the associations in upcoming events!

The Museum of Student Life has expanded its exhibition and activities to cover the student cultures of the entire Aalto community - technology, business and arts. In addition to technology students' culture, the museum now also presents the history and present of KY - Aalto University Business Students and TOKYO, Students of Art, Design and Architecture. In addition, AYY's art collection will also be presented in the exhibition collections. The museum is located at Jämeräntaival 3A.

Rental facilities

In addition to housing, AYY has numerous saunas, event venues and recreational facilities that members can rent. Some facilities are free of charge. AYY also rents a van.

Scholarships and project grants

You can apply for a project grant from AYY or the TTE-Fund for a project organised by a group of friends or an association. You can also apply for scholarships awarded by AYY.

You will receive a digital or plastic student card to prove your student status (card delivered by Frank). By showing your student status, you are entitled to hundreds of benefits from 1 Aug onwards, including Kela, Matkahuolto and VR, as well as to student lunch discount in student restaurants. You are also entitled to student discount in public transport in the metropolitan area if you live in the HSL area and have updated your student status in your travel card at the HSL service point or activated the student discount in your HSL-app. You can find the list of all benefits and discounts available with the student card on Frank's website at frank.fi.

The digital student card Frank App is an official student ID, which you can download and activate starting on 1 Aug once you have enrolled for attendance at the university and paid AYY's membership fee. You can check the prices of other card options on Frank's website. You can also add an ISIC license to both digital and plastic student cards. More information on different student cards can be found on Frank's website at frank.fi.

If you have chosen the plastic student card, please remember to pick up the academic year tag (aka. sticker) for your card from AYY's service point! At the same time, you can also pick up a free Design Notebook and a badge.

GREETINGS FROM THE HARASSMENT CONTACT PERSONS

First of all, we would like to congratulate you on your new study place!

Welcome to our rainbow-coloured community, where we want everyone in the guild to be able to have fun, and feel safe and comfortable at the same time. Prodeko has a zero tolerance policy towards harassment, discrimination, insults and bullying of any kind. **So as harassment contact persons, we are here for you!** Our harassment contact persons will listen to you and, if necessary, help you move forward with your case, always respecting the preferences of the person being harassed or bullied. From a small stream grows a big river, so even if something seems trivial, don't hesitate to contact us whenever you feel like it!

Prodeko's events follow the principles of safer space. The aim is to enable and ensure an equal and safe atmosphere so that everyone can come to events without fear of discrimination, harassment or bullying of any kind.



You can contact us by talking in person, through a message or through Härychat. Härychat is a very low threshold way to chat anonymously with a harassment contact person of your choice.

Safer Space Principles:

- No harassment, discrimination, sexism, racism or bullying of any kind is allowed in the Prodeko.
- Treat others with respect.
- If someone points out your behaviour, take the feedback/criticism constructively.
- Respect everyone's right to physical and mental integrity.
- Do not pressure anyone to use alcohol or other intoxicants or to engage in any other activity that the other person finds unpleasant.
- Ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate and be part of the community.

Vocabulary:

Harassment contact person or 'häry': Prodeko has five official harassment contact persons whom you can contact when ever, on any matter.

Event harassment contact person: The event organiser may appoint event-specific harassment contact persons who will act as the harassment contact person for the duration of the event.

Prodeko's Safer Space Policy: A document describing in more detail how guild members should behave in student life, as well as advice on how to deal with different problem situations.

Eettinen ohjesääntö: A code of conduct for the guild that describes the structures and practices of the guild to promote equality and a safe space.


